National Citation to a Dallas Companion


Each year, the Chapter is encouraged to submit the name of one member of the Chapter whose contributions have been above and beyond the call of duty.

KNOW YOUR COMPANIONS

Major Ralph Hodge, US Army (Ret)

Ralph L. Hodge was born in Washington, DC.



Following graduation from High School, he enlisted in the US Army and fought in Korean War (1951-1953), during which he was awarded the coveted Combat Infantryman's Badge, the Bronze Star for Valor and the Purple Heart for wounds received in combat.

After the war, He enrolled in the University of Maryland, and graduated with a BS degree in Construction Management. He earned a Master degree in Business Management from Central Michigan University and an additional master's in arts and Science degree from the US Command & General Staff College in Fort Leavenworth, KS.

Upon graduation he was commissioned in the US Air Force and served on active duty for the next 30 years (1961-1991). Among his many assignments, he was the Base Civil Engineer-at Andrews Air Force Base, Md.; the Deputy Chief of Staff for Civil Engineering-at the US Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs, CO; the Deputy Chief of Staff for Civil Engineering at the Alaskan Air Command, Elmendorf AFB, Alaska; and finally, as Air Force Regional Civil Engineer for the Western Region, San Francisco, CA.

In addition to his combat awards, which he proudly boasts of being the only Air Force Officer with a Combat Infantryman's Badge, he was the recipient of three (3) awards of the Legion of Merit Medal; as well as the Bronze Star Medal for Meritorious Service; two (2) Air Force Commendation Medals.


Following his Retirement from the Air Force, Ralph became the President and Owner of AFA Construction Group, a heavy civil construction firm.

Ralph is a widower, having lost his beloved wife, several years ago. He currently lives a well-earned life of leisure in McKinney, Texas.

Lieutenant Jack R. Coleman, US Navy (Fmr)

Jack Rue Coleman was born on 2 May 1933 in

Paris, Texas. After graduation from high school he enrolled at Southern Methodist University, where he earned his Bachelor of Arts Degree in economics. While at SMU he was a member of the Air Force ROTC. Eyesight issues prevented him from qualifying for flight training, forc-



ing him to withdraw from ROTC his senior year.

Still seeking commissioned service, he enlisted in the US Naval Reserve. Following basic training, he was assigned duty in the Pacific aboard *USS Saint Paul*. He applied and was accepted for Officer Candidate School in Newport, Rhode Island.

Upon earning his commission, he was assigned to the US Seventh Fleet, aboard *USS Bremerton* in the Western Pacific, where he served as a communications officer. While an Ensign, he was assigned as Flag Lieutenant to the Admiral at a time when issues of the location of atomic bombs were in the news. From the Seventh Fleet, his orders took him to First Fleet based in Coronado, California, covering the West Coast of the United States.

After completing his active duty, Jack returned to Dallas and joined Dental-Medical Economics, Inc., a professional management company for physicians and dentists. Following two years on Wall Street, he devoted his time to serving the health care professions. He developed the certification program for National Society of Certified Healthcare Business Consultants. He later served as President of the National Society.

Shortly after returning to Dallas he met and married his wife, the former Patricia Nelson. They have three children: Margaret, who lives in McKinney and is married to David Billings, a designer of golf clubs; Elizabeth, also in Dallas; and John who lives in Spartanburg, SC, with his family. Together, they have given him five cherished grandchildren.



November 11th, 2018 marks the 100th Anniversary of the end of the "*Great War*", *aka*: World War l.

On Monday, <u>12 Nov 18</u>, Companions of the Dallas Chapter will join more than 40,000 citizens of the greater Dallas Metroplex in commemorating Armistice Day by conducting the Greater Dallas Veterans Day Parade.
